Wood Hudson Cancer Research Laboratory is pleased to welcome Dr. Mary Kate Kilroy-Gehret to our research team. Dr. Kilroy-Gehret brings an impressive background in cancer biology and pharmaceutical sciences to the lab. She earned both a Bachelor of Chemical Engineering and Masters of Science degree in Bioengineering from the University of Dayton. Dr. Kilroy-Gehret recently received her PhD in Pharmaceutical Sciences with a focus in Experimental Therapeutics from the University of Cincinnati James L. Winkle College of Pharmacy working in the laboratory of Dr. Joan Garrett. Her doctoral research focused on the regulation and therapeutic targeting of KRAS expression in cancer which is important to the development of new precision medicine strategies.

In addition, she has authored and co-authored multiple peer-reviewed publications, including studies in *Carcinogenesis, Molecular Carcinogenesis*, and *Cancers* that study mechanisms of HER3 and KRAS in cancer along with potential therapeutic interventions. Throughout her graduate studies, Dr. Kilroy-Gehret served as a teaching assistant, mentoring undergraduate and graduate students. In addition to her scientific achievements, she presented her research at multiple American Association for Cancer Research (AACR) meetings, highlighting her commitment to advancing cancer research.

Recently married, she joins Wood Hudson after returning from a honeymoon in Honolulu, Hawaii. We are so happy to have Dr. Kilroy-Gehret join our team where she will continue to advance of mission of cancer research and education.
