Position: **Staff Scientist**

Responsibilities: Conduct research as well as write manuscripts and grant applications pertaining to cancer research. The successful candidate should already have publications in the field of cancer research and will supervise undergraduates doing research in our laboratory as part of the Wood Hudson Undergraduate Research Education Program (UREP). Over 270 undergraduates from 39 colleges and universities have participated in UREP. Nine colleges and universities give college credit for participation in this program. Our current undergraduates come from several regional universities. Students work in the laboratory on a regular basis and have journal and research discussions each week. The scientist is expected to act independently in developing their own ideas and to successfully complete research that will result in peer reviewed publications. The expectation is that the scientist will exert leadership in obtaining funding for research projects as well as leadership in guiding young scientists.

Our facilities include laboratories for cell culture, genetics, molecular biology, biochemistry, histology and microscopy. Over 2.2 million human surgical specimens are archived and preserved in the Wood Hudson Biospecimen Repository including specimens from over 60,000 cancer patients. Solid tumors from nearly all cancer sites are available for study. The organization is open to new ideas, new techniques, and new approaches to cancer research.
