Dear Friends: Looking to the New Year with hope and expectation, we realize there is still much to be done. These donors are recognized on pages 6 & 7. With your financial help this year, we were able to work with eleven undergraduate students in the Undergraduate Research Education Program (UREP). We saw two UREP students graduate from college and advance in their chosen careers at local healthcare related organizations and businesses. In November, two UREP students gave reports of their research at the Annual Meeting of the Kentucky Academy of Science held at Northern Kentucky University (NKU). Dr. Erik

Bey, who is now in his second year as a Senior Staff Scientist at Wood Hudson, authored a paper published in the journal *Genes* on resistance to therapy in non-small cell lung cancer. He subsequently submitted a grant application for additional non-small cell lung cancer research, which is currently under review at the Department of Defense. Progress was made on breast cancer and ovarian cancer projects that are still ongoing. Thanks to my loving family and some highly skilled physicians I came through a totally unexpected health problem and am looking forward to a healthy New Year! My recovery was made possible not only by the kindness of my children and grandchildren, but also by my friends who wrote supporting cards and notes and by the Wood Hudson Staff and Trustees who stepped up to the plate during my temporary absence while I was working remotely. 


22nd Annual Car Show Benefit on August 12th

<u>A Gift of Stock — Provides Tax Advantages:</u> A gift of appreciated stocks or mutual fund shares to Wood Hudson can provide you with the best tax advantages. You will get a charitable deduction for the full amount of the gift, just as you would if your gift was made with cash, and you don't incur capital gains tax on the appreciation. If you can't use all of the income tax charitable deduction resulting from the gift, you can carry it forward for up to 5 years!

<u>How to Transfer a Gift of Stock:</u> Gifts of stock or mutual fund shares can be given to benefit Wood Hudson. The proceeds can be directed to the Lab or designated to a program at the Lab such as our Undergraduate Research Education Program (UREP). For transfer instructions, please contact the Lab at (859) 581-7249.

Donating IRA Assets to Charity: Turn your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) into charitable donations. If you are 70 1/2 or older, you can donate up to \$100,000 tax free from your IRA each year to Wood Hudson. Your distribution will not be included in your income if it is sent directly to Wood Hudson.

<u>Utilizing a Charitable Trust:</u> A charitable trust allows you to donate cash or assets to Wood Hudson and obtain a current tax deduction even though the cash or assets are not actually transferred to Wood Hudson until some time in the future. There are basically two types of trusts – a Charitable Lead Trust (CLT) and a Charitable Remainder Trust (CRT).

A CLT is an irrevocable trust that is established to distribute an income stream to Wood Hudson for a set number of years. Upon the expiration of the trust, the assets that remain in the trust revert back to you, your heirs, or other designated beneficiaries.

A CRT works a bit differently than a CLT. A CRT is an irrevocable trust that provides you with a stream of income for your life or set period of years with the assets remaining in the trust going to Wood Hudson upon your death or the expiration of the trust period.

Which trust you decide upon, and the terms of the trust should be based upon your specific situation and what goals you have in mind. Establishing a charitable trust can be a rewarding way to make an impact for a cause you care about deeply while still retaining the benefits of a stream of income, current deductions for gift and estate taxes, and a current year income tax deduction when the trust is established.
